BLACKPOOL WINTER GARDENS The Empress Ballroom renovation

As specialists in ornamental plasterwork and restoration of historic buildings Hayles and Howe was honoured to work in association with Blackpool Council to carry out the repairs and conservation works to the Blackpool Winter Gardens 1890's Empress Ballroom ceiling designed and built by Mangall and Littlewood Architects. Hayles and Howe understand the importance of maintaining the heritage of significant venues such as this and used their expertise and traditional methods of craftsmanship to restore the ceiling to its former glory. The in-house craftsmen carefully documented the progress of the project with the added valuable input of 3D scanning.

HAYLES AND HOWE, INC. A SUCCESSFUL START TO 2018

In 2018, Hayles and Howe, Inc. won awards from Washington Building Congress (WBC) as well as Preservation Maryland, and Engineering News Record (ENR).

The WBC awarded Sandro Camargo, Jim Meade, Shawn Smith, Ian Jenkins, Wills Mayo, and Jose Gomez from Hayles and Howe, Inc. for their work at the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum Center in Bowie, MD. The work completed was at the David and Fela Shapell Family Collections,

Conservation, and Research Center. The center is dedicated to preserving objects that were in areas affected by the Holocaust at the time. Hayles and Howe, Inc. was asked to design, manufacture, and install a unique, glass fiber reinforced gypsum (GFRG) wall with removable panels.

Hayles and Howe, Inc. were also honored by Preservation Maryland with the "Artisan Award" for their work at the Hackerman House which dates back to the 1800's. Donnell McLeod (plasterer

on the job) and Mark Mordhorst (project manager) received the award at the Best of Maryland Awards on May 17th of this year.

Hackerman House was initially, a home that was later turned to commercial use as a museum, today it holds the Asian Art collection from the Walters Art Museum. Partnered with Lewis Contractors, Hayles and Howe, Inc. performed repairs on the ceilings, cornice, and walls of existing plaster throughout the building. They also patched holes and hung drywall in multiple areas.

Most recently, they were honoured with the Award of Merit Restoration by Engineering News Record (ENR) for their work at the Historic Cavalier Hotel in Virginia Beach, VA. The scope of work included manufacturing and installing cornice, pilasters and capitals.



Restoring the House of Representatives Offices

The House of Representatives were built an office in 1908, titled Cannon House Office Building. Cannon House happens to be the oldest of the three buildings created for the House of Representatives. Hayles and Howe, Inc. have been working throughout the building to recreate cornices, columns, and domes. Their work includes installation of base coat and finish plaster on numerous floors of the building. The work has spanned over the last nine months, with an additional month of creating a mockup to demonstrate our work. Both the workshop and site workers from the company are working to finish the job to ensure the building is restored to its former beauty. Not only are Hayles and Howe, Inc. using their skills with plasterwork, but working with Thomas Moore Studios to complete the paint in various rooms. Hayles and Howe, Inc.'s part on the job is expected to finish later this year.

The 1906 home is composed of modern design and architectural artistry, including intricate ornamental plasterwork. The building holds several floors for the multiple tenants that occupy the space. As a part of the business and civic community of Baltimore, City House is a place where business professionals can work and engage with others to share ideas and seek one another's perspective. The renovation of the building took over a year to complete as water damage had increased the deterioration of the existing fabric of the building.

Hayles and Howe, Inc. were called to repair rooms on each floor. The parlour received a new set of rosettes created by Hayles and Howe, Inc. to enhance the light fittings. Careful attention to detail in numerous areas was essential, whether it was a crack repair on the laylight or matching a crown molding. The project was completed on schedule and opened to the public in February.

ROYAL OPERA HOUSE - Covent Garden, London



Hayles and Howe have enjoyed working with the team at the Royal Opera House since 2014 providing maintenance programmes and ceiling inspections of their beautiful plasterwork. Over an intense three week period in August Hayles and Howe completed a full inspection of the plasterwork, consolidating, repairing and redecorating the follow spot hatches, the fibrous plaster ribs and the one hundred and sixty year old Bielefeld panels forming the dome. The works were carried out from a complex, hanging access platform.





PREPARATION FOR DECOREX INTERNATIONAL 2018

In the UK, Hayles and Howe are working hard building and preparing their impressive stand to showcase scagliola* at Decorex International 2018 at Syon Park in London on the 16th - 18th September, stand K60.

Visiting the stand will be well worth it as the design encompasses various scagliola wall paneling and enrichments as follows: Light Siena panels, a Greek Antigue panel, Pearl Grey panels, Ashburton dado rails and framing, all complemented and set off by a Hayles and Howe standard range cornice HH73 large enriched Georgian.


HAYLES AND HOWE LTD WIN TWO CONTRACTORS AWARDS FROM FIS

Hayles and Howe are extremely proud to have scooped a double at the FIS awards held at the Dorchester Hotel in London on the 5th June 2018. The FIS Contractors Awards were as follows:

FIBROUS AND GRG NEW BUILD SILVER

FOR A SCAGLIOLA AND FIBROUS PLASTERWORK PROJECT AT LEATHERSELLERS HALL IN LONDON

A major remodelling of Leathersellers Hall was carried out by Eric Parry Architects (EPA) and the main contractor Brookfield Multiplex. Hayles and Howe were approached by the architects to discuss the restoration and application of 18 Scagliola pilasters which had been removed from the original hall. EPA wanted to reuse the 50 year old Scagliola in a modern design as pictured below left.




To complement the Scagliola pieces the background of the walls was to be fibrous plaster subtly expressing different levels and shadow lines. Hayles and Howe rose to the challenge, solving the many structural problems posed by the age and condition of the original pieces which needed full museum level conservation as well as the installation of a modern hanging system complying with current regulations. The tolerance worked to was very fine and setting out the entasised pilaster sections to hang away from the walls was a particular technical achievement. Curved work, specialist lighting details and contrasting surface finishes contribute to a stunning, high precision finish and a unique realisation of the architects design intent.

HERITAGE SILVER FOR THE REFURBISHMENT OF THE PICCADILLY THEATRE IN LONDON (ATG)

The works included a full redecoration and re-construction of the EML rendered ceiling and the surrounding original fibrous plaster works. Hayles and Howe also advised ATG on a methodology to reconstruct the dome which had been severely damaged over the years. There were many technical challenges during the project including



creating complex fibrous plaster ellipses using old techniques, the manufacture and installation of new access points in the ceiling for future shows, designing new features to complement the original ceiling, consolidation of a lattice cove and surrounding lighting troughs this was completed within a very strict timeline of 4-6 weeks. The theatre is now back to its original beautiful design, providing the theatre with better lighting, ambience, and a general feel good factor when watching the shows.

HAYLES AND HOWE, INC. - The Metropolitan Opera House grand restoration

Over the past few months, Hayles and Howe, Inc. shop worked day in and day out to make pieces for the Metropolitan Opera House in Philadelphia. The opera house was built in 1908 and used for various concerts, sports events, and church services. After hitting a point of vacancy, it was acquired by the Holy Ghost Headquarters and Eric Blumenfeld. Their decision to restore the opera house saved it from demolition. The contractors asked for assistance from Hayles and Howe, Inc. to restore the ornamental plasterwork which had incurred major deterioration with many pieces that were needing fabrication. Pieces from multiple areas were collected from site and brought to the shop for evaluation, repair, and creation of molds. Following the mold-making process, the shop manufactured rosettes, crowns, leaves, and egg & dart panel moldings. In early May, the restored and renewed pieces were delivered on site and installation commenced at the opera house. Once finished, Live Nation will manage the venue for concerts. The opera house is expected to reopen on December 13, 2018 to coincide with its original opening 110 years ago.
